Dr. **Khalil al-Anani** is a senior fellow at the Middle East Institute in Washington, D.C. He is a leading academic expert on Islamist movements, Egyptian politics, and democratization in the Middle East. He has also served as a scholar of Middle East politics at the School of Government and International Affairs at Durham University, UK, as a visiting fellow at the Brookings Institution in Washington, D.C., and as a senior scholar at Al-Ahram Foundation in Cairo. Dr. al-Anani is the author of many books in both Arabic and English, including two forthcoming books: *Unpacking the Muslim Brotherhood: Religion, Identity, and Politics* (2013) and *Elections and Democratization in the Middle East* (2013). He writes a bi-monthly column in the pan Arab newspaper *Al-Hayat* and in the Cairo-based *Al-Ahram Weekly* and is a frequent commentator on Arab and international television channels, including Al Jazeera, BBC, Al Arabiya, and Alhurra.
